



## Kenneth J. Paulus

April 1, 1935 - November 9, 2019

Kenneth J. Paulus, 84, of Perryville, died peacefully Saturday, November 9, 2019 at Independence Care Center in Perryville, surrounded by his loving family.

He was born April 1, 1935 in Perryville, MO to Leo B. and Mildred (Claussen) Paulus.

He married his high school sweetheart, Patricia Zoellner on June 29, 1957. She survives in Perryville.

Kenneth was a 1953 graduate of St. Vincent High School and a 1964 graduate of Southeast Missouri State University. He was a teacher and coach at St. Vincent de Paul High School in Perryville and Chester High School in Chester, IL. He was loved and respected by the many lives he touched as a school teacher, coach and friend.

He was a member of St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church, Knights of Columbus 4th Degree, American Legion, and St. Vincent Alumni Association. He was an inaugural member of the SV Alumni Association Hall of Fame as well as many other honors through his life and career. He was a US Army Veteran.


