“ Tami was one of my very first friends. We lived across the street from each other as little girls, even before we were in kindergarten. I remember long summer days of playing outside together with our siblings and other neighbors. I recall many hours spent on the Tarrillions' front porch and the time I pulled Mrs. Tarrillion's plant shelves over trying to climb to the top so I could sit up high — and instead found myself covered in cactus needles. Tami's mom was always such a sweet, gentle woman, and if she got mad at me for the mess I made, I have no memory of that; she made a soothing baking soda (I think) paste and put it on my wounds. Another time we were playing flashlight tag with Tami's big brothers and I ran into a barbed wire fence in the dark (those were dangerous days!) and cut my chin; I still have the little scar. Mrs. Tarrillion was probably relieved when our family moved a few years later!

Even after we moved, Tami and I sometimes met at the corner and walked to school together. As teens, we were in CCD and band together. We lost contact after high school, until Tami joined Facebook last year and connected with me. I had heard she'd had some serious health problems, but she was always so positive and encouraging on other people's posts. I messaged her before the holidays and asked if I could visit her when I was in town, but I never got a reply. I sent her a New Year's card but still heard nothing from her. I noticed she didn't respond to her numerous birthday wishes on Facebook. Now I'm wondering if she was ill at that time, and unable to respond.

How I wish I had been able to reconnect with Tami in person, but I'm glad we at least had a year of social media contact. I will always have a special place in my heart for her.
