Wallie G. Breig, 72, of Perryville, Missouri died peacefully at his home Thursday, October 15, 2020 in Perryville, MO.

He was born April 26, 1948 in Perryville, MO to George William and Roberta Agnes (Basler) Breig.

He and Barbara L. Wills were married on August 20, 1988 at St. Marys Catholic Church in Independence, MO. She survives in Perryville.

Wallie was a member of St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church in Perryville and Toastmasters in St. Louis. Wallie served in the United States Coast Guard and was a member of the American Legion Post 133, Knights of Columbus Council 1263 and the Libertarian Party.

Wallie wore a coat of many colors throughout his life. A lifelong learner, Wallie loved to read and was well versed on many subjects. He enjoyed a good debate and could hold his own on many topics.

As a career economist for 33 years with the US Department of Labor he traveled extensively throughout the states collecting survey data used by the government for economic decisions. In retirement he published his annual economic forecast to friends and family and was always almost right.

Wallie loved to play cards. His greatest joy was to bluff his opponent into dropping their better hand. He would laugh and drag the pot.

In his younger days, Wallie developed quite a reputation for having too much fun. His motto was "I have to get older, but I don't have to grow up". Marriage to Barbara changed his perspective about growing up. He often said "she saved my life and gave me a new and better life". His lakeside home at Lake Perry was his pride and joy having aided in the

design of the living spaces built by Amish craftsmen.

Wallie was a gentle, kind and generous person. He loved all animals, but especially his cats who he gave special family names.

He enjoyed canoeing and kayaking on the lake and swimming at the park center.

He loved his Catholic faith and practiced its tenets faithfully throughout his life. May God welcome him into heaven and give him a seat at the table, but be careful Lord, he could be bluffing.

Survivors include Sister, Dianna Breig Rindl of Perryville, MO; Brother in law and sister in law, Larry (Charolett) Wills of Lowry City, MO. He is also survived by cousins, many nieces, nephews, Godchildren and good friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents and Brother in law, Manfred Rindl.
