Billy Ray Pickle, 97, of Perryville, Missouri passed away Friday, January 9, 2026 at his residence.

He was born June 25, 1928 in Hartford, AR to Owen Galveston and Willie Margarite (Pitchford) Pickle.

Billy and Babara Harbottle were married September 6, 1958 in Hartford, Arkansas. She preceded him on November 10, 2021.

He served in the United States Air Force during the Korean War.

Billy graduated from the University of Arkansas with a degree in Physical Education and went on to receive his Master in Education from Southeast Missouri State University. He worked as a football coach and P.E. teacher in his hometown of Hartford, AR and as well in Booneville, AR. In 1966 Billy and his family moved to Perryville, MO where he taught P.E., Health and Drivers Education. He also was a football, basketball, baseball, golf, track and field coach. Billy was very proud of his 1968 State Football Championship. He spent many years as a bus driver for Perryville and St. Vincent schools. He was very well known as a teacher, coach and bus driver but, most importantly he was a loving husband, a proud father, PaPa and PaPa Coach.

Billy was a member of Lithium Baptist Church, and American Legion Post #133.

Survivors include three daughters, Debbie (Mark) Regelsperger, Brenda Cobb, Terri (Ron) Halter, son, Randy (Nikki) Pickle; nine grandchildren, Andrea Buell, Lindsey (Andrew) Hecht, Bethany (Jared) Kutz, Audrey Cobb, Braden Cobb, Adam (Taylor) Halter, Andrew (Sarah) Halter, Alexis (Nate) Wills, Allison (Ryan) Jones; eighteen great-grandchildren.
