Carl T. Henneke, 84, of Perryville, died December 28, 2017 at Southeast Hospital in Cape Girardeau, MO.

He was born August 29, 1933 in Silver Lake, MO, son of Henry A. and Caroline (Taylor) Henneke. He and Laverne P. Welker were married for 58 years, May 2, 1959. She survives in Perryville, MO.

He had been owner operator of the Sinclair Gas & Service Station from 1970-1972. He then became owner operator of the Mobil Gas & Service Station at the Interstate from 1972-1979. He then became owner operator of Carl's Muffler & Brake Shop in Perryville from 1979 - 1995. He later worked for Perryville EZ-Pump from 1995 to 2011. He was a member of St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church, American Legion Post 133, AmVets Post 94, and Knights of Columbus Council 1263. He was a US Army veteran of the Korean Conflict from 1953 – 1955. He loved to hunt, raise beagles, play cards, dance, watch sports, listen to music and spend time with his family and friends.
