My brother, Walter Heimbaugh, and I came up from Cape and spent a week during several summers in the early 1960's in Friedenbergh. During one visit Charlie had a black electrical wire about 9 inches long. He would toss the wire at us individually and yell "snake." I was sitting at the supper table beside Charlie. I waited for the right moment. I startled Charlie during supper. Everyone laughed at Charlie's reaction. I remember Louie said, "Rita you got him good."*
