Donald A. Barry, 94, of Perryville died April 17, 2016 at Independence Care Center of Perry County, MO. He was born February 28, 1922 in Alexandria, LA, son of Wilfred B. and Lyda R. (Richard) Barry. He and Dorothy F. Schumer were married on December 28, 1974. She survives in Perryville. Donald was an educator who was also Co-Founder and Administrator with his wife Dorothy of Montessori Educational Center in Alexandria, LA. He was a member of St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church, St. Vincent de Paul Society in Perryville of which he was instrumental in establishing, former volunteer of Perry County Memorial Hospital Auxiliary and Southeast Hospice. Former member of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart during which he was a missionary in Africa for 15 years. Other survivors include one sister, Amelia Brown of Zachary, LA.
