



## Edwin Arthur Schrank

January 2, 1942 - July 28, 2024

Edwin (Ed) Arthur Schrank, age 82, a resident of St. Joe Manor in Bonne Terre, MO, died on 28 July 2024 at the Parkland Hospital in Farmington, MO after battling dementia for several years.

Ed was born on 2 January 1942, the oldest child of the late Otto and Melvina (Solchenberger) Schrank. Ed was a 1960 graduate of the Wonewoc High School, Wonewoc, Wisconsin.
