



## Gregory Elwood "Greg" Dunn

Gregory Elwood Dunn (Greg), age 70, of Perryville, Missouri, passed away Thursday morning, January 9, 2025, at his home in the country.

Greg was born on July 3, 1954, in Fort Wayne, Indiana, to Elwood Wallace and Vangie Rose (Mathews) Dunn. He spent his childhood years in Marion, Illinois, with his parents, later moved to Makanda, Illinois, and most recently to Perryville, Missouri. He is preceded in death by his parents.
