Rev. Louis J. Franz, 86, of Perryville died July 11, 2018 at St. Mary's Of The Barrens in Perryville, MO.

He was born July 27, 1931 in New Orleans, son of Valentine Joseph and Hilda Marie (Trege) Franz Jr.

Rev. Franz entered Novitiate at St. Mary's of the Barrens in Perryville on May 23, 1948, Professed Vows at St. Mary's of the Barrens, Perryville on May 23, 1950, Ordained Deacon at St. Mary's of the Barren , Perryville on October 7, 1956, Ordained Priest at St. Mary's of the Barrens, Perryville Joseph E. Ritter on June 2, 1957, Provincial of the Southern Province and Superior of the St. Mary's of the Barrens.

Survived by nephews and nieces.

He was preceded in death by his parents and brothers and sisters.
